

**MINUTES OF A COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS COMMUNITY COUNCIL

Gordon Nicholl called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

General Business

Upon motion made by Bill Morris, seconded by Ann Bracken, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

Sheriff's Report

In the absence of Deputy Scott Hansen, Detective Clint Johnson gave the sheriff's report. He reported the crime figures for April and reported on the solving of about 300 crimes in the area, including the break-in at the Recreation Center.

Fire Department Report

Steve Halligan gave the statistics for the month of April. He also reported that Station 10 would be getting a new rescue truck on May 15th 2003. Some concerns were raised as to how this would affect the coverage when the truck was out on a call.

Steve gave a safety tip on the use and labeling of household pesticides and cleaners.

Water Rate Restructure

Save our Canyons

Tom Stevens of Save our Canyons addressed the issue of the FAA proposed new flight path.

Mr. Stevens requested that the Council send a letter to the FAA asking that the period for public hearings and input be extended for 60 days, to allow for more public input.

Upon motion made by Sheryl Ivey, seconded by Ann Bracken, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED to send a letter from the Council supporting the Save our Canyons in its request to ask for an extension.

Salt Lake County Recycling

David Lewis of Salt Lake County presented the new county program for recycling. This program has already started in Magna. It is a voluntary program and there is a \$3 per month charge for any household wishing to participate. The items will be collected every two weeks and will include all recyclables, other than glass.

Another new program is the Bulk Waste Day where the County will leave a large container on non-busy streets for one week, and residents can put bulk waste in at no charge.

Also available are the programs for having containers left at your home for "green waste" for \$20 and bulk waste for \$30 plus \$23 per ton disposal fee.
