

MINUTES OF THE CITY COUNCIL MEETING HELD NOVEMBER 13, 2007, AT 7:00 P.M., IN THE COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS CITY COUNCIL CHAMBER

1.0 WELCOME/PLEDGE/ACKNOWLEDGEMENT

1.1 Mayor Cullimore called the meeting to order at 7:15 p.m. and welcomed those attending.

1.2 The pledge of allegiance was led by Councilman Bruce Jones.

1.3 Mayor Cullimore recognized Kevin Bryant, representing the Youth City Council.

2.0 CITIZEN COMMENTS

2.1 Don Machin, questioned why the City has not approached Holladay and asked them to combine efforts for law enforcement services. He also thinks everyone in the County should be combined under one police department.

3.0 REPORTS/PRESENTATIONS

3.1 Teen Advocates Against Tobacco

3.1.1 Teen Advocates Against Tobacco Miller Camou, Sam Ellis, Drew Richards, James Ellis, Isaac Tedroe, Jasmine Narcessian, introduced themselves and explained the opportunities provided by their organization. They educate the youth about tobacco and the importance of having a smoke free environment. There are nine 'smoke free' cities in Salt Lake County and they would like Cottonwood Heights to participate in this program.

3.1.2 Kathy Bigler, Salt Lake Valley Health Department Tobacco Program Manager, distributed a packet to the Mayor and Council with information about the cities that have gone 'smoke free' and a copy of their ordinances.

3.1.3 Mike Peterson, Cottonwood Heights Parks and Recreation said that smoking is a concern at the skate park and ball fields and he does receive complaints from citizens. He said that being 'smoke free' is a national trend and they would be supportive of this move.

Councilman Bracken suggested there be a resolution from the Cottonwood Heights Parks and Recreation Board supporting a smoke free environment..

3.2 Salt Lake County Sheriff's Report

- 3.3.1 Detective Ford reviewed the statistics for the month of October. He noted that this month there were 1064 calls for service which generated 683 cases.

Mayor Cullimore questioned how many of the 683 cases would go to pooled services.

Detective Ford said that the categories of cases sent to investigative services are family offenses including domestic violence, both criminal and noncriminal in nature as well as child abuse cases and child neglect cases. In October there were 22 family offense cases of which 13 were noncriminal and nine were criminal. Out of the nine criminal cases, eight were cleared by the deputy on scene and one needed additional follow-up and was sent to the investigations unit. There were two robberies in the month of October which are active and ongoing at this time; five sex offenses this month, one of which was a referral from DCFS and two were women accosted by a male suspect which are both still active investigations.

Detective Ford noted that burglaries are down and larcenies and increased in the month of October. October was also the highest number of drug cases with the majority being marijuana, and some heroin, cocaine, and prescription drugs.

He updated the Council on the Dr. Stack case which is ongoing and anticipates it will go to the grand jury within the next few weeks. There as been approximately \$1.3 million seized from Dr. Stack. Once the case is adjudicated, as much as 40 percent should come back to Cottonwood Heights.

4.0 **ACTION ITEMS**

4.1 **Consideration of Ordinance No. 102 Amending and Restating Chapter 19.83 (Wireless Telecommunications Facilities) of the Cottonwood Heights Code**

- 4.1.1 Councilman Thomas moved to adopt Ordinance No. 102 amending and restating Chapter 19.83 regarding wireless telecommunications facilities. The motion was seconded by Councilman Jones and passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

4.2 **Consideration of Resolution No. 2007-44 Approving an Interlocal Cooperation Agreement Between Salt Lake County and Cottonwood Heights for the “One Million Trees for One Million People” Grant Project**

- 4.2.1 Mayor Cullimore explained that this will approve the interlocal agreement with Salt Lake County and the City agreed to participate in the amount of \$1,000 in order to get a matching grant for trees.

- 4.2.2 **MOTION:** Councilman Bracken moved to approve Resolution No. 2007-44 approving the interlocal agreement with Salt Lake County for the “One Million Tress for One Million People” grant project. The motion was seconded by Councilman Antczak and passed unanimously on a roll call vote.

4.3 **Consideration of Resolution No. 2007-45 Approving an Amendment to the Interlocal Agreement Between Salt Lake County and Cottonwood Heights City for Election Services**

- 4.3.1 Councilman Antczak moved to approve Resolution No. 2007-45 for election services provided by Salt Lake County. The motion was seconded by Councilman Thomas and passed unanimously on a voice vote.

5.0 **ADJOURN BUSINESS MEETING NAD RECONVENE WORK SESSION**

- 5.1 Councilman Antczak moved to adjourn the business meeting and reconvene the work session. The motion was seconded by Councilman Thomas and passed unanimously on a voice vote. The business meeting adjourned at 8:10 p.m.
