John D. Fife February 8, 1909 – 1923

Constructed as a garage and later converted to a house.

Birth September 25, 1863 Ogden, Weber, Utah Territory

Death January 21, 1944 Los Angeles, California

Parents William Nicholl Fife\* (Oct 16, 1831-Oct. 21, 1914) Diannah Davis (1836-1884)

Married Eliza Jane Stewart February 18, 1889 Logan, Cache County, Utah

Salesman for Co-op Wagon and Machine Company

1896 moved to Montpelier, ID and 1900 back to SLC.

Nine Children: Cornelia Diana, John Daniel, Viola Elizabeth, Stewart Blaine, William Earl, Marguerite Stewart, Samuel Stewart, Harold Davis, Isaac Sherman Fife

Moved to California after the death of Eliza in 1933

\*Born 16 October 1831 in Kincardine-On, Forth, Perthshire, Scotland. Came to Utah in 1853. Married Diana Davis in 1854 in SLC. They had 9 children. He was a member of the 37th quorum of the 70's for the LDS church, and a member of the Ogden High Council. He was a coroner for Weber County 1869-1880. Ogden City Marshall from 1861-1876. Deputy US Marshall in 1866. Colonel of the 1st Regiment Weber Military District. Architect and builder of the Ogden Tabernacle. (see autobiography)

Father Isaac Mitton Stewart\*\* (1815-1890) Moth Elizabeth White (1838-1917)
