

Obituary for Mrs. Sarah Rogers Williams Denny, 1945

Mrs. Sarah Rogers Williams Denny, 86, died Wednesday at 6:30 a.m. of causes incident to age. She was born April 11, 1858, in Longford, England, daughter of George and Lucy Porter Rogers. At the age of four she and her parents moved to Auckland, New Zealand. In 1876, she was married to James Clark Williams and shortly after the couple moved to the United States and made their home in American Fork. Mr. Williams was justice of the peace, and Mrs. Denny was clerk of the court for a number of years. They later moved to Salt Lake City where the family had lived since. Mr. Williams died in 1925. In 1935 she was married to Charles Denny, Union, who died in 1938. Mrs. Denny had been active in LDS church work, having served as a president of the Relief Society in Auckland, and having participated in musical activities of the church. She is survived by five sons and daughters, Jay B. Williams, South Cottonwood; Mrs. Ada Miller, Oakland, Cal.; Mrs. Lucy E. Price, Union; Mrs. Olive Wiseman, Murray, and Mrs. Ivy R. Ekker, Eureka; the following stepchildren; Sam, John, Edison and Franklin Denny; Mrs. Laura Barret, Mrs. Jessie Smith, Mrs. Ruth Young and Mrs. Naomi Smith. Funeral services will be conducted Saturday at 1 p.m. in Union LDS ward chapel by Golden Berrett, bishop. Burial will be in Salt Lake City cemetery.
