

**MINUTES OF A COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS COMMUNITY COUNCIL
MEETING HELD MARCH 5, 2003 AT 6:30 P.M. IN BUTLER MIDDLE SCHOOL**

PRESENT: Gordon Nicholl, Bill Morris, Sheryl Ivey, Paul Childs, Ann Bracken, Jerri Harwell, Suzanne Bitter, Chris Cage. Excused – Mike Peterson

Gordon Nicholl called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

Kevin Overby of Troop 331 led the Pledge of Allegiance.

Sheriff's Report

Deputy Scott Hansen reviewed the crime statistics for February. He then introduced Lt. Rod Lowry who will present a new programming concept for the sheriff's department.

Directed Patrol Policing

Cottonwood Heights will be divided into three areas and each area will be manned exclusively by the same deputies. This will make the deputies more in tune with the neighborhoods and give them ownership. Each area will be in a team concept. The goals of the program are to reduce crime, and improve communications and cooperation between the public and the sheriff's department.

Upon motion made by Bill Morris, seconded by Sheryl Ivey, and passed unanimously it was

RESOLVED to have Bill Morris write a letter to the Salt Lake County Sheriff stating that the Council likes the concept presented by Lt. Lowry and would like to see it implemented, with the maximum number of deputies possible.

Fire Department Report

Steve Halligan reported on the statistics for February. He then gave some safety tips on emergency preparedness. Have an out of state contact for all family members; have a meeting place for family; don't call 911 for updates; check with school to see if children will be kept there or sent home; don't shut gas off to home if you leave it.

ACCT Report

Chris Cage reported on the last ACCT meeting. Items discussed were: legislative update; fire district update; details of community council funding for 2003. The council needs to send in a budget to Kara Trevino showing how the money will be spent in 2003. This should be a discussion item on the April agenda.

Salt Lake County Mayor's Office

Jim Braden reported on these items:

The board of adjustments decision on the Terry Diehl property at the mouth of Big Cottonwood Canyon;

Draper City's decision to have its own police department;

Fire District will probably be a go;

6 months moratorium on billboards in unincorporated area;

Save our Canyons is planning on going to court over the Terry Diehl decision.

Review of Recommended Citizens to Planning and Zoning board for the township

The township consists of four community councils and each council is asked to submit recommendations to the Salt Lake County Mayor for members of the planning and zoning board. Anyone interested or knowing anyone interested should submit the name to a member of the council by next Tuesday. The names will be reviewed and submitted by the Council.

Camino Way to 2300 East

The Council received a letter from Jane Hawkes, who is concerned about the potential accidents which could be caused by some dead foliage in a yard to the North of the intersection which blocks driver's view of 2300 East.

Upon motion made by Sheryl Ivey, seconded by Ann Bracken, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to send a letter to Salt Lake County Public Works attaching Ms. Hawkes's letter and asking if they can review this problem.

Miscellaneous

Robert Jacobs, a concerned citizen with two areas of concern.

The first was the development at the mouth of Big Cottonwood Canyon, which had been addressed earlier in the meeting.

Upon motion made by Sheryl Ivey, seconded by Ann Bracken and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to have Gordon Nicholl write a letter to Salt Lake County Council and to Save our Canyons expressing the Council's support of Save our Canyons.

His second concern was the proposed FAA's addition of an air corridor, which would be directly over the Cottonwood Height's area. There will be a meeting on March 18th at 7 p.m. in the Marriott City Center (near the Gallivan Center) where the public will be allowed input.
