GENERAL BUSINESS

Upon motion made by Bill Morris, seconded by Ann Bracken and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

CANDIDATES FOR SALT LAKE COUNTY SHERIFF

Fred Trujillo, representing Beau Babka, a candidate for County Sheriff, gave a short report on Mr. Babka's campaign and his platform.

Aaron Kennard, the present County Sheriff, and a candidate in the upcoming election then took a few minutes to discuss his platform and the issues he felt strongly about.

AMBULANCE LICENSE

Jim Braden, of the Salt Lake County Mayor's Office introduced Max Berry, North Area commander of the Salt Lake County Fire Department. Salt Lake County Mayor and Salt Lake County Fire Department are requesting license to run an ambulance service in conjunction with the present paramedics program. This would entail no additional costs and no additional personnel.

SHERIFF'S REPORT

Deputy Phillip Vollmer, substituting for Deputy Scott Hansen, gave the sheriff's report. He reviewed the crime statistics and gave tips to avoid forgeries.

Lane Hilton, substituting for Steve Halligan, presented the fire department report. He gave information on the upcoming fire prevention week. October 6th – 12th. The fire stations will be open to the public and ridealongs can be arranged for persons over 18.

ACCT MEETING

METROPOLITAN WATER DISTRICT OF SALT LAKE CITY AND SANDY

John Robert Carmen of the Metropolitan Water District of Salt Lake City and Sandy reviewed the background of the District. He also reported on the current activities, retrofitting certain facilities and building earthquake resistant facilities, etc. He invited the Council to come and he would give a personal tour to anyone interested. He reviewed the traffic statistics for the facility showing that there really was a minor impact from the District on the neighborhood.

COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS SERVICE AREA

Mike Peterson, representing Cottonwood Heights Parks and Recreation Service Area, advised the Council that the Service Area was starting construction on a splash play pool, targeting younger children, this month. The bid came in over the budgeted amount. The Service Area has approached Salt Lake County to see if there is any available money from ZAP funds. The Service Area was established to provide supplemental recreation services to the people of Cottonwood Heights and this contribution would enable Salt Lake County to participate in this project.

Upon motion made by Bill Morris, seconded by Ann Bracken, and passed unanimously it was

RESOLVED, to write a letter of support for this request to the Salt Lake County Mayor.

AMBULANCE LICENSE

Upon motion made by Mike Peterson, seconded by Cathy Trane, and padded unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to send a letter to the Salt Lake County Council in support of the mayor's request for an ambulance license.
