

**MINUTES OF A COTTONWOOD HEIGHTS COMMUNITY COUNCIL
MEETING HELD July 2, 2003 IN BUTLER ELEMENTARY SCHOOL, 7500
SOUTH 2700 EAST, SALT LAKE CITY, AT 6:30 P.M.**

Gordon Nicholl called the meeting to order at 6:30 p.m.

General Business:

Upon motion made by Ann Bracken, seconded by Mike Peterson, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

Sheriff's Report

Detective Scott Hansen, because of the reorganization of the sheriff's department was unable to present the crime stats. for June. He briefly mentioned the Night out Against Crime and possible locations for it. This will be discussed in more length when Bill Morris is present.

Upon motion made by Ann Bracken, seconded by Mike Peterson, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to authorize the expenditure of up to \$100 towards updating the signs for Night out Against Crime.

The safety tip for the month – keep your garage door closed at all times. Garage theft is on the rise and is happening in broad daylight, in the presence of the residents.

Fire Department Report

Steve Halligan gave the stats for June.

Steve's tip of the month was regarding use of fireworks. Wear long sleeved shirts, gloves, goggles, don't turn your back on the fireworks, have a bucket of water and sand at hand, only adults should light them, use on a paved surface. Teach your children to stop, drop and roll. Don't approach any fireworks which failed to ignite, for 30 minutes after attempting to light them.

No open flames are allowed above Wasatch because of the extreme fire danger.

ACCT Report

There was no ACCT report.

Salt Lake County Mayor's Office

Jim Braden reported for the Mayor's office.

The Council has approved bi-annual emission and safety inspections.

The Fire District concept is in jeopardy, the council is reviewing a fire authority.

Wasatch Mountain Club

Will McCarvill reported on the road claims currently on file for the Wasatch Mountains. If these claims were exercised it would greatly reduce the appeal of the wilderness areas by opening them up to traffic, including off road vehicles. There are literally hundreds of such claims. He asked the Council to consider the Wasatch Mountain Club's position and see if it could support the club's request to have the County relinquish all but the fifteen claims that are already in place.

Upon motion made by Jerri Harwell, seconded by Ann Bracken, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to bring this back to the next month's meeting, giving the Council time to consider the question.

Capital Requests for Salt Lake County

Mike Peterson reported on the capital request list submitted to Salt Lake County. These include #1 Bair Park, #2 Resurfacing tennis courts, #3 Toilets at the Skate Park, and #4 the continuation of trails in the area, and specifically Butler Park.

Upon motion by Ann Bracken, seconded by Mike Peterson, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to approve these submittals after changing the priority of #2 and #3.

ZONING

No zoning issues were received in a timely manner for the meeting. Blain Walker who is developing 5 acres East of Wasatch Boulevard just North of Bengal Boulevard was present to give details of his project. This project has to first go to the Township Planning Commission. The Council will request that this item be returned to the Council for community input.

The meeting was adjourned at 7:40 p.m.
