

Notice of Special Meeting of the Cottonwood Heights Community Council

The regular meeting of the Cottonwood Heights Community Council will be delayed until 8:00 p.m. on Wednesday, October 6, 1999 to accommodate a request from Salt Lake County Commissioner Mary Callaghan and State Senator Mont Evans from Riverton to host a town meeting. According to an article in the Saturday, October 2, 1999 issue of the *Salt Lake Tribune* the primary subject will be reviving a plan to eliminate most of the county's remaining unincorporated areas through wall-to-wall cities.

This special meeting will begin at 6 p.m. at the Butler Middle School, 7530 South 2700 East, in the school's auditorium. It is vitally important that as many Salt Lake County residents as possible attend this meeting so your voices can be heard. The goal of Commissioner Callaghan and Senator Evans, according to the news article, "is to reintroduce a bill during the next legislative session that will smooth a city's ability to annex adjacent unincorporated areas, speeding up the wall-to-wall concept."

The Cottonwood Heights Community Council is investigating the feasibility of an incorporation effort in the near future. Our position is that we must either incorporate or face the possibility that Sandy or Midvale, or some other municipality, may annex the Cottonwood Heights area. The probability of remaining unincorporated Salt Lake County appears to be lost if the current quest for wall-to-wall cities is realized. **We want to know your viewpoint on this important topic.**

Please plan to attend this special meeting on Wednesday, October 6, 1999 at 6 p.m. It is vitally important that our elected officials hear our collective voices concerning this important matter concerning our future.
