

**MINUTES OF A COMMUNITY COUNCIL MEETING HELD MARCH 3, 1999
AT 6:30 P.M IN BUTLER MIDDLE SCHOOL**

GENERAL

Joan Carman called the meeting to order at 6: 30 p.m.

Troop 709 led the Pledge of Allegiance

Joan Carman led a moment of silence.

Upon motion made by Richard Guthrie, seconded by Bill Morris, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to approve the minutes of the previous meeting.

SALT LAKE COUNTY PUBLIC WORKS

Joan Carman introduced Denny Mecham, who was representing Tosh Kano, of Salt Lake County Public Works.

Denny presented some plans for re-paving of some of the roads in the community. He answered questions regarding sidewalks, traffic control, etc. from the Council.

SHERIFF'S REPORT

Kent Mackay, representing the Sheriff's office, requested support from the Council in the event the unincorporated areas of Salt Lake County become wall to wall cities.

He requested that the Council send in a letter to the County expressing the council's support. The Council felt that it should also include snow removal, road maintenance, etc. and a review of the Council boundaries.

He also discussed the importance of reporting graffiti and having it removed as quickly as possible.

ACCT REPORT

Carl Durling reported on ACCT.

Carl had submitted a letter to the County requesting a feasibility study on incorporation, taking into consideration joining with Granite, and the possibility of Cottonwood Creek and South Cottonwood Councils. Carl will let all members of the Council have a copy of this letter.

The next step is a letter to start the incorporation proceedings.

Upon motion made by Bill Morris, seconded by Richard Guthrie, and passed unanimously it was

RESOLVED, to form a committee of 3 members of the Cottonwood Heights Council with membership representation from other councils interested in incorporating. Carl Durling would chair this committee. Other members from Cottonwood Heights would be Bill Morris and Joan Carman.

Carl requested that the Council reimburse him the \$10 fee to ACCT.

Upon motion made by Richard Guthrie, seconded by Bill Morris, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to approve this payment.

Roger Urhahn was present to ask if the Council could foresee any problems with an application to construct a garage at 7477 S Butler Hills Drive. It will be an agenda item next month.

Upon motion made by Greg Alex, seconded by Carl Durling, and passed unanimously, it was

RESOLVED, to adjourn.
