General Business:

Fire Department Report

Steve Halligan gave the stats for May 2004.

Steve echoed the sheriff's statement that there is a definite increase in the use of drugs in the area.

He reminded us that the heat season is upon us. Remember to drink lots of water, wear a hat, light clothing, sun screen. If you are thirsty you are already dehydrated. Other signs are headache, nausea and not urinating for long periods of time.

Gordon Nicholl commended station #10 on their treatment of a friend of his who had gone into cardiac arrest several times, but was now doing O.K.

Incorporation

Gordon Nicholl reported on the recent incorporation. A public hearing had been held May 25th at Bella Vista School. After the meeting the sponsors made the decision to have 4 districts and decided the boundaries.

The terms for District 1 and 2 will be for 2 years. The terms for district 3 and 4 will be for 4 years and the mayor's term will be for 5 years the first time and four years after that.

Anyone interested in running for office should register between June 8 and 18th. If necessary, a primary will be held August 3.
