## Hinnenkamp Cronin

Agnes H. Cronin passed away September 12, 2002 at the age of 101.

She was born July 13, 1901 in Okarche, OK to Henry and Kath-erine Giefer Hin-nenkamp. Agnes married Charles Cronin in 1929 in the first church built in Los An-geles. Charles died in 1939. Agnes came to Utah with her parents in 1912 and settled on a large farm which is now "Top of the World" and the Smiths shopping center. She attended public school at Jordan High School. She was an active member of the Catholic Church and was confirmed by the first Bishop of Salt Lake City, Bishop Scanlon. Agnes worked at Lockheed during World War II as a riveter. She spent 20 years in Oregon but moved back to Salt lake in 1979.

She is survived by sisters, Irene McPolin, Katheryn Kolesar; brother, George Hinnenkamp; three nieces; and one nephew. She was preceded in death by her parents; husband; sisters, Elizabeth Brown, Dorothy Moeller, Cecilia Moses; and brothers, Joe, Vincent Hinnenkamp.
