### College Boys Will Strive to Get Some Practice in the Contest—Wilkes Challenge Not Accepted.

A football game is scheduled for today between All Hallows college and the National Guards. The latter team averages about ten pounds heavier to the man than the college boys. All Hallows plays the game for the experience there is in it, while the Guards will endeavor to take the dust out of their opponents' coats for the lesson given. It will be the first time that a school team has lined up against an athletic team this season.
